Budget Call

This month starts the rate setting and budget process for 2025. We will analyze the revenue and expenses of the last seven months, i.e. January through July; review the labor market; talk to vendors as to what kind of price increases are on the horizon; study the newest regulations as to any upcoming requirements. The projected expenses are then recalculated to see what is needed to raise our rates to function well.

The results will be discussed in the Strategic Planning Meeting in September with a recommendation to the Board of Directors in late September. Resident representatives are on both of these committees, please feel free to give feedback, or talk to Ro.

The Small Things Matter

I didn't grow up in a church with a lot of liturgy (like the Catholic, Orthodox or Episcopal traditions for example), but I have always appreciated their services when I have visited them. There is a rhythm and an intentionality to every component of the service.

When we are at our best, our daily lives mirror these types of worship services. We become immersed in the practices that make up our daily routines. The question is not "do we have liturgies," but "what kinds of liturgies do we have?" Sit down sometime and think through everything you did from the time you woke up until the time you went to bed. How many of those things do you do on a regular basis?

Most of our liturgies happen reflexively. This is a good thing if your liturgy is a centering prayer before a meal or brushing your teeth before you go to bed. It's a little more troubling if it is scrolling through your phone as soon as your alarm goes off or finishing off a bag of Doritos before bed.

Our liturgies matter because by the end of our lives they will comprise the largest amount of the time we spent doing anything on this earth (with the exception of sleeping perhaps). And the reality is, we are easily seduced by other liturgies. We find a lot of stories like this in the Old Testament, where good people ended up on the wrong path following other gods and developing different liturgies.

E. Byron Anderson writes:

If the church does not, or will not, engage us in practices of worship that shape explicitly Christian lives--that is, in practices that habituate us, enclothe us, and indwell us in the Jesus tradition--than other cultural forces will gladly step in to fill the empty space.

Let us recommit to being intentional about the small things. After all, they make up the witness and the testimony that we leave for others to follow. $\varphi_{alou} \varphi_{btman}$
