The care my mother is receiving at the Sierra View Skilled Nursing Facility is so good it brings tears to my eyes. The entire staff - medical, social work, administrative, support, dining, dietary - everyone! - has been warm, kind, competent, responsive, proactive, and just plain helpful. Even when things have slipped through the cracks, as will inevitably happen when caring for a group of people with complex medical needs, they have been gracious, quick to respond and acknowledge, and take action.

The dining room, aka Founders Room, is a hub of activity during the day, full of windows and light, often music, sometimes with Pianist Rudy playing for the residents as they dine. A variety of scheduled activities occur daily, both in the Founders Room and elsewhere in the facility, including The Bistro, a large, high-ceiling, many-windowed room where coffee and cookies and soft-serve ice cream is served. Creative coloring, music and movies, "hand spa" aka full-on manicures, and gingerbread house making are just some of the opportunities for socializing, self-care, and creative engagement I've seen offered.

But really, beyond responsive, competent care and social connection, the most pervasive and important element we are experiencing here is *kindness.* Real, present, grounded kindness, unforced and unhurried. I am so grateful that my mother has the opportunity to be cared for here.

The Power of Lament

Our weekly Bible Study at Sierra View has recently begun a study of the book of Lamentations. It is a short book of five poems, expressing shock, grief and lament over the destruction of Jerusalem by the Babylonians. There is a rawness to the grief expressed that is unsettling, almost scandalous. Is there a place for such outbursts in our spiritual lives?

Biblical scholar Kathleen O'Connor writes:

Laments are prayers that erupt from wounds, burst out of unbearable pain, and bring it to language. Laments complain, shout, and protest. They take anger and despair before God and the community. They grieve. They argue. They find fault. Without complaint there is no lament form. Although laments appear disruptive of God's world, they are acts of fidelity. In vulnerability and honesty, they cling obstinately to God and demand for God to see, hear and act.

Part of living in a fallen world is learning how to navigate our trauma and loss and the hopelessness that comes with it. With time, we learn how to fit these times into the narratives of our lives, but in the moment, when our lives are upside-down, it is good to have a book like Lamentations that can model lament, reminding us that we can cry out to God from the truest parts of our souls, even before the healing process begins.
