
Kiwanis "To build"

Lessons on the Road

It is hard for me to comprehend the level of disorientation the disciples were feeling in the days and weeks following the crucifixion and resurrection. The trajectory of life as they expected it had come to a screeching halt. They had given up livelihoods and perhaps even families, to follow Jesus. And now...what?

In Luke 24 two disciples process all of this as they travel to the village of Emmaus. As they spoke, Jesus came up alongside them and asked what they were talking about. Jesus walks with them the entire way without revealing his identity. The scene is both humorous and perplexing. Why does Jesus act in this way towards these downtrodden disciples?

What is there to be learned about Jesus as teacher and shepherd? It strikes me that there are lessons in life that we learn from quietly listening to people, absorbing the wisdom of their words. Undoubtedly the disciples spent plenty of time learning in this way. But there are other times where we have to come to certain conclusions on our own, thinking and processing out loud, even if the process isn't perfect.

Jesus allows for the disciples to voice their fears and questions, then he teaches. And only after this, when they have arrived at their destination, do the disciples receive their breakthrough revelation:

When he was at the table with them, he took bread, gave thanks broke it and began to give it to them. Then their eyes were opened and they recognized him, and he disappeared from their sight. They asked each other, Were not our hearts burning within us while he talked with us on the road and opened the Scriptures to us? (Luke 24:30-32)

The disciples had to leave behind the life they knew for one of incredible uncertainty. It would be worth it of course, but they all had to come to that conclusion on their own terms. They did so with Jesus at their side, teaching and encouraging, but never coercing. May our teaching and mentoring carry the same grace and compassion as we walk with others on the path set before us, accompanied by the risen Christ.
